The Beast Feast in February went well, made \$800 and 500 people attended. The Student Conclave was held in March and they placed 9 th out of 24 teams. S. Baraoidan is the incoming new President.	 S. Old Business

TWS Sponsor-a-Student Campaign

D. Gawlik led the discussion to give a complimentary national TWS membership to students. Test this with 4 students this year, scholarship committee to choose.

Discussion:

- M. Zondervan asked why not give a FLTWS membership to a student too? Do we choose a graduate student? Undergraduate student? There was a question of students graduating and leaving the state.
- L. Perrin suggested we could do this for new hires with a Florida company or agency to ensure they'd stay in Florida - provide membership to a young professional. Criteria needs to be created, suggestions were the following: one time only membership to new hires; put opportunity announcement on website rather than a selection process and blanket agencies and universities.
- **A. Brunell** suggested this could be partnered with a mentor to assist them.
- L. Perrin suggested the membership chair along with M. Zondervan and whoever else get together to finalize the options and report to the summer board meeting.

Enhancing Conservation Capabilities of FTWS

D. Gawlik suggested a structure of a Conservation Chair (**B. Bolt**) and several other people in different regions to commit to at least two conservation/environmental issues per year. The regional reps would do the research, documentation, and report back to **B. Bolt** to finalize the handling of the issue for us. This new process would help bring issues to the committee, filter the issues to decide what and how to respond, and do the research for ease in FTWS response.

Discussion:

- B. Bolt added that we also have letters or responses needed asap (especially from FL Wildlife Federation). These are needed too quickly for the Chapter to respond at times so individual members can respond and speak for themselves on the issue.
- H. Boyter suggested FLTWS be a member of the Florida Conservation Coalition (FCC). The benefit would be to raise our visibility and they would filter conservation issues for us.
- D. Gawlik asked H. Boyter to write up something about the Florida Conservation Coalition for the Board to review and address at the summer Board meeting.

- Ad hoc committee of B. Scheick and M. Zondervan to make recommendations about mentoring and sponsoring students by summer board meeting.
- H. Boyter to prepare info on FCC for Board to address at Summer Board meeting.
- **B. Bolt** to work with others for issue assignments.
