Website	M. Milleson email report:Since the spring conference the website committee has focused on the transition of duties and knowledge from prior chair (P. Delaney) to current chair (M. Milleson). The process is approximately 80% complete.

	The committee would like to explore other options for website maintenance and hosting. The current arrangement only allows website changes to be done from computers running Adobe contribute (only 3 licenses for this) and Adobe contribute is overly complicated for the task of simple web page updates. The committee would like to find out if an option exists where website can be updated from any	

computer with a simple user interface – we know that services with these features exist; we just need to find out if our current website can be ported over, and how difficult/costly it would be to do so.

--Online forum: the idea for an online forum on the website will be explored. This would allow comments to be posted on certain topics or be a place for discussions.

#### Old Business

#### United Way as Fundraising Mechanism

A. Brunell email report: Looked into reapplying to have FLTWS on the FSECC list of charities. The issue of conducting a sufficient audit as defined in FL Statutes is the hurdle. Two alternatives were identified at the last Board meeting: (1) National TWS on the list of charities since they conduct an acceptable audit, and they would funnel money to FLTWS. Result: National TWS concerned there would be confusion with a federal campaign similar to FSECC, and hesitant to get involved with our state program. (2) Apply as FLTWS and use the National TWS audits as the basis for answering "yes" on the application audit question. Result: National TWS's audit has little to do with subunits and only report total income and expenditures; however, they are happy to provide this to FSECC is requested. DMS said that it is up to the applicant to determine if National TWS's audit is sufficient to meet the requirements of the FL Statutes. There is no place to provide an explanation on the application when answering this question. The Florida Statute 110.181(1)(g) that applies to the application process: "Any nonprofit charitable organization participating in the Florida State Employees' Charitable Campaign must have its financial records audited annually by an independent public accountant whose examination conforms to generally accepted accounting principles".

#### Discussion:

- National TWS's audit doesn't count as a detailed audit for FLTWS, and Board is not comfortable checking "yes" on the application.
- D. Gawlik stated that if it becomes economically feasible to do an audit in the future we would look into it, or if another reason came up.

- A. Alshouse to gather additional information on insurance and distribute to Board prior to fall meeting.
- Affiliated Meeting Support Subcommittee policy approved.

#### Insurance

**A. Alshouse** reported on insurance quotes: he obtained quote information from two companies (Sihle and Ryan). Insurance can be general liability, board liability, or could get both. Sihle quoted \$705.69/year for general, Ryan \$1,117.40. Ryan also provided a quote for director/officer liability but have to choose coverage amount (quote ranged between \$744-2,744/year).

#### Discussion:

- E. Myers asked if board insurance covers general too (i.e. bodily injury etc.). Is it better to have both?
- **K. Booth** stated that we should have waivers signed for workshops and field trips.
- D. Gawlik stated that waivers may not mean much legally, but would show that we are doing everything we can.
- D. Gawlik asked if general insurance would protect the board, although seems unlikely that anyone would go after board members individually in case of an issue. General insurance sounds like what we are looking for.
- E. Myers asked about injuries during workshops/field trips, or during any event, as well as property damage. Would the board need additional insurance on top of general insurance?
- All requested that less than \$700 be spent. A.
   Alshouse stated that rates will likely increase/decrease with membership numbers.
- **A. Alshouse** will follow up with insurance companies on questions (are both general and board insurance necessary and who is covered exactly by each and for what). The issue will be revisited via email or conference call so that a decision can be reached by the fall meeting.

#### Affiliated Meeting Support Subcommittee

**E. Myers** reported on the subcommittee's (formerly ad hoc committee) development of a policy on FLTWS providing meeting support. The subcommittee is under the Fundraising committee, and met in April

and July to develop a goal and duties for each subcommittee member.

<u>Goal</u>: The goal for assisting with outside meeting registrations is a combination of support, exposure and profit. We believe in supporting other non-profit conservation organizations; however, we need to receive some profit to cover costs and members' time.

Discussion on subcommittee member duties:

- President-elect's duties on assisting with mail/fax registrations: shouldn't the Treasurer be responsible for all moneyrelated activities? Maybe other Treasurer duties should be re-assigned to accommodate handling all registration duties.
- Would a future President-elect who may not be familiar with this activity know how to assist with this?
- Should mail and fax (hard copy) options for registration be eliminated? How many do we typically receive?
- Treasurer's duties with merchandise: merchandise sales will be decided on a meeting by meeting basis.
- Merchandise will be split up to have materials in north, central, and south FL. The members with merchandise will track meetings in their respective area and keep track of merchandise sales.
- D. Gawlik questioned a "waived fee" for smaller organizations – FLTWS should be compensated at least for costs and time. FLTWS is directing time and energy that would otherwise be directly benefiting FLTWS to other groups and their meetings. We should not incur a net loss.
- E. Myers stated that smaller organizations could cover credit card fees and other expenses accrued during the meeting registration process.
- M. Ward asked about what determines a "smaller organization". Should it be defined?
   E. Myers explained it will most likely be determined on a case by case basis.
